The Australian Early Development Index (AEDI) is a population measure of young children's development. As a population measure, the AEDI places the focus on all children in the community; it examines early childhood development across the whole community. By moving the focus of effort from the individual child to all children in the community we can make a bigger difference in supporting efforts to create optimal early childhood development.

The AEDI has been used in some communities in trial projects. Sally Brinkman has had a significant role in the development, trialling and utilisation of the AEDI.

This is an opportunity to learn more about the previous use and potential of the AEDI for communities, schools, government agencies and other services supporting young children and their families.
